First-ever eARTh Day Celebration at Reston Town Center April 20

With a twist – an art-inspired celebration of the day!

March 28, 2024 (Reston, VA): The Reston Town Center Association (RTCA) and Tephra Institute of Contemporary Art (Tephra ICA) today announced that they will jointly present an art-inspired celebration of eARTh Day on April 20, with a full day of programming that is FREE and open to the public.

"This aligns with RTCA's forward lean in promoting impactful art experiences that both enrich and educate," said RTCA Executive Director Robert Goudie. "We always welcome the chance to partner with Tephra ICA, a content leader in the DMV. With support from Reston Community Center, ArtsFairfax, George Mason University, and LOOK Dine-In Cinemas at Reston Town Center, we think we have something that will capture the imagination and bring forward the importance of this day in a compelling way."

"Art often serves as a lens to help us understand the world around us, and artists have the unique ability, through their work, to spark conversation around contemporary issues, including the earth, land, and environment," said Tephra ICA Executive Director and Curator Jaynelle Hazard. "This collaborative event with RTCA presents a special opportunity to celebrate reverence for the natural world and the impact that art and artists can have in shaping sustainability."

The full schedule of events is attached and includes a special installation at Mercury Fountain Plaza by Arkansas-based artist <u>Danielle Hatch</u> that is presented by <u>Reston Community Center</u>. The installation, titled *All Is In Motion, Is Growing, Is You,* features bold colors and shapes informed by native flowering plants of Northern Virginia, taking inspiration from the founding of Reston, Virginia and Robert E. Simon's vision of community building.

Also included on the schedule of events are curator-led tours of the <u>Pressing exhibition at Tephra ICA</u>, supported by ArtsFairfax; an environmentally themed concert with <u>GMU Professor Victor Provost's Steel Pan Ensemble</u>; a host of Tephra ICA-coordinated afternoon art activations in Reston Town Square Park; and a FREE screening of <u>Anthropocene: The Human Epoch</u>, with an introduction and post-film Q&A led by <u>GMU Professor Jeremy Campbell</u>, sponsored by and shown at RTC's LOOK Dine-In Cinemas.



"We are excited to be bringing this new event to the region," said Ms. Hazard and Mr. Goudie, adding, "We hope it will become an annual way to not only bring awareness to the challenges we face but to offer ideas on what we all can do to help heal the earth."
